The animals were beautiful and very friendly (except for one very greedy sheep that chased us all around to make sure he got his share of the food). The peacocks put on a show and they had white-tailed deer that would eat out of your hand. The house tour was ok, but short. If you're pressed for time or money, I'd skip it, you really wouldn't miss anything. The nature tram was great and I would highly recommend it. The guide was really good about stopping to allow us to stand up and move around a little bit to take pictures. The gardens were beautiful, but mostly just green. I would love to come back a little earlier in the season to see the azaleas blooming as they were pretty much finished by this late in May. They did have lots of summer flowers out, it just wasn't the profusion of colors like you see in their early spring photos. I can see us coming back here again as it was very enjoyable.
 - One note, we ate at the Peacock Café on the Plantation just because we ended up running a little late past lunch time before we were anywhere near ready to leave. The food was ok, but very expensive (\$7.50 for a ham or chicken salad sandwich, \$4 for a hotdog, \$2.50 each for a small bag of chips or a drink). I wish we had packed a picnic lunch and brought it with us as that would have been very nice and much, much cheaper. We'll probably do that the next time.
